Every eligible child attending public school in Nova Scotia is automatically insured by the School Insurance Program's Basic Plan student accident coverage. This coverage is provided without deductible and at no cost. Basic Plan coverage can cover things such as physiotherapy, dental and medical equipment expenses, up to policy limits.

However, if parents/guardians wish to purchase additional coverage, the Gold Plan increases the time that your child is covered to 24/7 including summer vacations. Many

of the specific loss accident payments are triple those of the Basic Plan.

GUIDANCE NEWS: GETTING OFF TO A GREAT START!!

My name is Denise Chiasson and I will be your school counsellor. I am looking forward to seeing some familiar faces, as well as getting to know some new students. Wishing everyone a fantastic year. Things to remember...

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1. Attendance: It is very important to attend on a regular, daily basis - you can't win it if you're not in it.

- **2. Punctuality:** Be on time for all classes and activities. This is a life skill! Learning how and what to do happens at the beginning of class.
- **3. Early to Bed:** Getting 8-10 hours of sleep every night makes it easier to be alert in school each day scientists say so not just your parents and teachers.
- **4.** A Solid Breakfast: Proper eating habits affect learning. Every if you don't think you feel hungry, your body needs you to fuel it. We offer a breakfast program every day. Take advantage and put your brain in gear.
- **5. Good Study Habits:** Use an agenda or your phone calendar to stay organized. Keep it up-to-date so you know what you have to do and when things are due. 

### Notice to Families Information Sharing Agreement with Chief Electoral Officer of Nova Scotia

In accordance with Sections 42(4), 42A and 43(5) of the Elections Act, the Chief Electoral Officer of Nova Scotia is and maintain authorized to gather information about 16- and 17-year-olds who would qualify as electors when they become 18 years of age. In addition, it authorizes for Elections Nova Scotia to be provided the personal information held by a public body as required to create, revise or update the Register of Electors. The Register of Electors is a database of Nova Scotians who are qualified to vote in provincial elections.

An Information Sharing Agreement signed by the Strait Regional Centre for Education (SRCE) with the Chief Electoral Officer of Nova Scotia authorizes the SRCE to share, on an annual basis, information about 16-and 17-year-old students directly with Elections Nova Scotia for the sole purpose of adding them to the electoral list when they become eligible at the age of 18. The specific information to be shared includes student ID, school name, student's full name, gender, date of birth, mailing address, civic address and indicates if a student is currently enrolled in school.

Elections Nova Scotia is subject to the Freedom of Information and Protection of

Privacy (FOIPOP) Act and collects information under this agreement for electoral purposes only. Please note that as students reach 18 years of age and are added to the Register of Electors, they may correct and/or update their information and/or opt out of the registry at that time if they wish by application to the Elections Nova Scotia Office.
